



Footgolf further information

Before you arrive

1. Appoint a named organiser for your group who will be your contact with the Club.
2. Make your booking. Note, Juniors under 16 must be accompanied on the course by an adult i.e. (at least 1 adult for every eight juniors)
3. Download the [Organiser Agreement Form](#).
4. Print this form off and sign it to confirm you have read the following and shared these with your group.
 - What to wear for your FootGolf - see below
 - The [FootGolf rules and dress code](#) to give you some idea of the rules and some other options to wear on the course if you wish to really look the part
 - What to wear in the Clubhouse - see below
 - The Club Code of Conduct - see below
 - The Player Contract - see below

It is the responsibility of the organiser to understand this information and to share/forward this information to the rest of the group. All members of the group must fully understand the dress code, code of conduct, the player contract, and basic rules of the game before you arrive for your booking.

On the day

If the weather is wet, please see the Bad Weather section below.

Bring the completed Organiser Agreement Form with you and present it in the Pro-Shop before paying your fees.

Failure to provide a completed form at this time will result in the group forfeiting the booking

- Arrive no later than 15 minutes before your tee-off time
- Register and pay for your game at the Pro-Shop.
- Pay £2 for ball hire or you can bring your own ball if you wish.
- Ensure you have enough adults to accompany any juniors (1 for 8)

What to wear for your FootGolf

- Outdoor sportswear but please no professional football team strips
- Jeans whilst welcome in the Clubhouse are not recommended out on the course.
- Trainers or 'Astros' (3G pitch shoes with rubber 'nubbins') or golf shoes but no boots with studs, spikes or blades as they can damage course.

What to wear in the Clubhouse

We have excellent changing facilities available and ask that wet gear, hats, football shorts, tracksuits, shell-suits, Professional football team strips are not worn in clubhouse.

The Club Code of Conduct

We are proud of our club; it's a family friendly environment, with members and visitors from 8 to 85 years of age. We expect all players and visitors to conduct themselves in an appropriate and courteous manner.

We expect all players to-

- Demonstrate the upmost respect for all other players and staff.
- Always show respect for the course and facilities.
- Treat everyone as you'd like to be treated.

Examples of unacceptable behaviour are (but not reserved to)

- Foul language of any kind, either if it is directed at someone or not.
- Aggressive behaviour of any kind.
- Being intoxicated before or after play.
- Distracting other players through unnecessary noise levels on/off the course.

Failure to abide by the code of conduct may result in the offending individuals sent from the premises, and in more serious cases, a ban from the club and the club contacting the proper authorities.

The Player Contract

Playing any sport outside has the potential for injury. Slips and trips are commonplace in sport and may be expected, and FootGolf is no different. Players must also be aware that wet ground conditions are possible on the golf course and of the additional risks that this presents.
